Position Summary

SES is seeking two (2) full-time term Outreach Workers to support all students and their educational goals. As part of the school-based support team, the Outreach Worker plays a capacity-building role in working with parents and the community. The Outreach Worker, in collaboration with parents, teachers, and SES staff, assesses the needs of each student for a successful school year and long-term planning. The Outreach Worker will support wellness goals, develop programs to suit and support student/family needs.

The Opportunity:

The Outreach Worker works daily alongside our Clinical Counsellor, Educators, Families, Elders, Knowledge Keepers, and community partners to guide students and families towards a successful educational journey.

- Develop and create trusting relationship with students and families
- Design and facilitate programs/activities to inspire children and families to be engaged, motivated, and eager to attend school daily

- Collaborate with students, staff, and families in a respectful manner
- Attend family homes to support parents and student needs as necessary
- Facilitate learning experiences and programs incorporating Stz'uminus culture, Hul'qu'mi'num' language and Coast Salish ways of knowing
- Facilitate and/or participate in the development of student growth by supporting the students' learning plans, determine success criteria and a self-assess progress as needed
- Communicate ongoing successes of student learning and well-being
- Participate in the development of student, parent and/or family programs that meet the needs of the student and school goals
